Georgi Sabev
Deputy Minister of Agriculture of Bulgaria

Mr. Georgi Sabev is Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Bulgaria from August 2022 as he is in charge for application of EU policies in the area of agriculture, rural development and fisheries. He was also Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Food and Forestry from June 2021 to December 2021.

Mr. Sabev has graduated International Business at the Tampere University of Applied Sciences in Finland. Also, he has Master in Economics from the University of Food Technologies in City of Plovdiv in Bulgaria and Master in Economics and management of EU agriculture and rural areas from the Agricultural University Plovdiv. From September 2012 to June 2021 and from December 2021 to August 2022 Mr. Sabev is MEP Policy Adviser in the European Parliament on topics related to Common Agricultural Policy (CAP), geographical indications, rural development, fisheries, international trade.



Inge Van Oost
European Commission, DG Agriculture and Rural Development

Inge Van Oost is policy officer at the European Commission, Directorate General Agriculture and Rural Development (DG AGRI). She has been setting-up and is now supporting the implementation of the European Innovation Partnership "Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability" (EIP-AGRI), with responsibilities for the rural development programmes and strengthening linkages between research and rural development policies. As member of the DG AGRI



Taskforce "Research and Innovation" she was instrumental in shaping DG AGRI's research and innovation approach in Horizon 2020 Work Programmes since 2012, and developed the new research project formats "multi-actor approach" and "thematic networks", for which she is still responsible. Meanwhile, one of her core tasks has become the development and implementation of the policy on Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems (AKIS) as part of the CAP post 2020, including some improvements related to the EIP-AGRI. In her former post at the Commission she was policy officer in the Direct Support Unit and the Cross Compliance Unit, responsible for cross-compliance, the Farm Advisory System and interlinking with the Rural Development policy.

Before working at the Commission Inge Van Oost was coordinator of the demonstration projects at the Directorate-General for Agriculture and Horticulture of the Flemish Region. There she drafted rural development measures and designed the farm advisory system. In the meantime, she was evaluator of many agricultural research projects and member of diverse selection committees. In the former federal Belgian Administration for Agriculture she served the Secretariat-General as coordinator of the Horticultural Chain, dealing with chain management, food quality, traceability and safety, sustainability of production methods, communication with consumers and much more. Before joining the administration, she worked as a farm advisor, and after a while as the coordinator of the advisory team. Based in an applied research institute, the team did not only advise farmers, but also brokered and implemented multi-actor experiments and on-farm demonstration projects.



Dimitar Vanev
National agricultural advisory service and international cooperation

Dimitar Vanev has been working in the field of rural development for 19 years. He holds a post-graduate specialty: "Economics and Management of agro-industry". He is specialized in Strategic management, Sustainable Rural Development and Agricultural policy development.

Dimitar Vanev worked for nine years at the Rural Development Directorate to the Bulgarian Ministry of Agriculture and Food. Most of his tasks were related to CAP and the development, monitoring, implementation and evaluation of the Bulgarian rural development strategic plans and programmes supported under the European Agricultural Rural Development Fund and other CAP and national schemes.

Since 2010 Dimitar Vanev works at the Bulgarian National Agricultural Advisory Service (NAAS). He has managed



- the activities of NAAS specialised administration related to the distribution the information about Rural Development programmes, CAP, development
- preparation of projects supported under CAP schemes and programmes,
- training of farmers and providing advisory assistance for farmers
- the transfer and application in the practice of scientific achievements,
- the development of a database of scientific-technical and business information within the information system of the NAAS, collection from the farms of accounting information.

He has about 40 publications concerning strategic management in Agriculture and Food Processing, Supply Chain Management and Rural Development. He was short-term and middle-term expert as well as Team leader under different EU Twinning and TAIEX projects related to Rural Development and CAP. Also, he is the leader of work package 7 "Communication on demo-farm activities and dissemination of practical-oriented outcomes" under Horizon 2020 project NEFERTITI. He is also involved in Climate Farm Demo and modernAKIS.

Sylvain Sturel is an agricultural engineer MSc. with seven years' experience in agricultural and rural development in Africa and Asia. His task was to coordinate teams of agricultural and rural advisors.

Since 2003, he is in charge of European and international projects at Chambres d'agriculture France. These projects deal with the capacity building of farmers and advisors on various topics like farm business management, innovation on farms, developing products with high added-value, reducing the use of pesticides, etc.

Chambres d'agriculture France is the national umbrella organization of the French Chambers of Agriculture. The Chambers are public bodies led by elected representatives, which represent the interests of farmers to public authorities and provide services to farmers and other rural stakeholders. Overall, they employ around 5000 advisors, including about 350 agronomy advisors, 700 organic farming advisors, 1000



advisors on plant protection, 85 forestry advisors and about 1,000 livestock advisors.

Sylvain Sturel is or has been involved in ten Horizon 2020 projects and four Horizon Europe projects dealing with interactive innovation (AttractISS and modernAKIS), as well as adaptation and mitigation of climate change (ClimateFarmDemo and ClimateSmartAdvisors).

In particular, he coordinates i2connect, a project which aims at creating a European-wide network of advisors involved in interactive innovation support.
