

1st TG meeting


- Setting the scene


Similarities identified across sectors

Informal online discussion #1 – 20 April

Trends in rural employment

- Specificities: rural villages vs. remote rural areas vs. rural areas close to the cities
- > Remote work became more popular during COVID pandemic but not a 'game-changer' nor an answer to all rural challenges
- Definition of "green jobs" often associated with investment in renewables vs. broader definition including sustainable jobs, small-scale initiatives, mainstreaming "green" approach in education & training to consider impact of climate change
