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

What is an Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System (AKIS)?

<u>What:</u> AKIS is the organisation and interaction of persons, organisations and institutions who <u>use</u> and <u>produce knowledge and innovation</u> for agriculture <u>and</u> interrelated fields. (def)

<u>Who:</u> The main players of the AKIS are: farmers/foresters, advisors, researchers, (farmer) organisations, NGOs, networks, retailers, media, services, various ministries...: they all produce and need knowledge!

<u>Why:</u> The aim is to create a <u>regional/national</u> innovation ecosystem by enhancing knowledge flows between the AKIS players as well as strengthening links between research and practice.

AKIS at the heart of the agricultural innovation ecosystem => Cross-cutting CAP support to Systematically share

Knowledge and Innovation in Agriculture and rural areas including in whatever farming and rural activities automatically relate to (= environment, climate, biodiversity, landscape, consumers and citizens, food and non-food systems including transformation and distribution chains, etc)

Where does the AKIS policy come from?

In their 2008 declaration, the researchers of the Standing Committee of Agricultural Research (SCAR) stated that the <u>classical linear research model does not function anymore</u> to have real impact in the field. The current CAP AKIS policy and potential interventions can make use of the current formats and experiences from MS. Experts from about 24 MS from the SCAR Strategic Working Group collected this in the AKIS4 report, and based it on their discussions and own practical experiences. In the report much about AKIS in all its aspects is explained and a long series of possible types of interventions and concrete examples given. AKIS Coordination Body - Overall tasks

- The AKIS coordination body (CB), should be (inter)acting as the spider in the AKIS web of the country, interconnecting all key AKIS influencers
- The AKIS coordination body is the <u>contact point</u> for all AKIS related issues towards the European Commission: let us know the precise person/unit please.
- It should <u>cooperate</u> with AKIS related platforms across the geographical levels in the country, and should be following qualitatively and quantitively day-to-day AKIS interventions and actions, to <u>know exactly how AKIS is going forward</u>
- The AKIS CB has the <u>main responsibility</u> and should be in a position to <u>ask a</u> <u>modification of the CAP plan</u> if needed, while continuously supporting interaction & implementation of the AKIS Strategic plan. Make AKIS interventions as attractive and effective as possible, so that they become successful.
- The AKIS CB should **keep an <u>overview on the progress and performance</u>** foreseen in the CAP plan, through monitoring and evaluation, in particular using the CAP <u>indicators</u> (Annex I CPR CCO/AKIS tool, see Section 2.6), and other indicators (see guidance on AKIS evaluation of the Evaluation helpdesk).

AKIS Coordination Body- Organising advice

The AKIS coordination body should be (inter)acting as the spider in the AKIS web of the country, interconnecting all key AKIS influencers

- It is the task of the AKIS coordination body to <u>organise the advice and</u> <u>advisors</u> according to the <u>new advisory approach</u> in the CAP 2023-2027, offering advice in a <u>transparent</u> way (website with advisors on public Min. website) Art 15(1)
- The AKIS CB should ensure advisory support stays open for <u>all expertise of</u> <u>impartial public and private advisors</u>, in particular the most trusted ones.
- Ensure frequent and effective <u>training of advisors</u> by competent experts.
- And to ensure coverage of all (obligatory) fields in Art 15(2) and (4) in a smooth way which does not produce overly administrative burden
 (ensure fresh inflow of expertise to cover any aspect of sustainability and competitiveness & limit unnecessary selection/eligibility criteria). see ex day 2.

E.g. Simplified administrative burden for knowledge exchange and advice:

- 1) Vouchers for knowledge actions (R.2021/2115 Art. 78): see examples BE & NL at the June 14-15 AKIS Seminar in Vilnius day 2
- 2) Building knowledge reservoirs for practice:

use:

- Technical Assistance (up to 4% of EAFRD total amount Art. 94),
- An OG building a knowledge hub (Art 127)
- A knowledge exchange intervention (Art 78 e.g. setting up of advisory services)

The EU-Farmbook project is in the hall to explain connection to the EU knowledge reservoir for practice

E.g. Simplified administrative burden for OGs:

- 1) Simplified costs: **one lump sum for the whole OG project if decided at selection phase** (Art 83(2)(b) R.2021/2115). Need to
 justify the calculation in the project proposal => <u>support for</u>
 <u>preparation of OGs is useful to help calculation</u>. Under the old
 RDP budgets idem but only up to 100.000 Euro max
 (R.1303/2013 Art. 67(5))
- No notification for State Aid necessary up until 500.000 Euro per project (new ABER Reg 2022/2472 - Art.40) thanks to broad communication on the project
- 3) Advance payments up to 50% of the project (R. 2021/2116 Art 44(3))

Simplified administrative burden for Innovation support services:

- Often part of <u>EIP interventions (Art 77 & 127)</u>: using simplification = lump sums for <u>preparation</u>: 4000-9000 Euro depending how big the group. Still very much OK and frequently used, but in combination with indicating who is responsible for capturing ideas
- Advisory interventions (Art 78): the CAP plans in this period now more and more include <u>innovation advice</u> as a separate advisory package
- <u>Technical assistance</u> budget (Art. 94) is also used, possibly for outsourcing, because the task is too intensive for the national CAP networks. Typically also for regions in regionalized MS.

AKIS in CAP Strategic Plans (Art.114 - R.2021/2115)

The CAP Strategic Plans shall contain:

- 1. Their contribution to the cross-cutting objective related to fostering and sharing of knowledge, innovation and digitalisation, notably by describing:
 - The (future) organisational set-up of the AKIS: which organisational improvements are needed? (based on a SWOT)
 - How advisors, researchers and CAP networks will work together within the framework of the (future) AKIS, e.g. ensure regular knowledge exchanges among them, possibly developing national knowledge hubs/reservoirs
 - How advice and innovation support are provided, e.g. developing advisory back-offices with specialised advisors and innovation support services

AKIS Coordination Body - Networking and collaboration

- In particular, better <u>collaboration</u> between advisors, researchers and the **CAP network** must be ensured by specific initiatives (Art 114)
- The above responsibilities make it most likely that the AKIS coordination body is **situated in the RD Managing Authority** of the Ministry of Agriculture,...
- But <u>supported by (existing) networks/platforms/competence</u> centres etc: do not reinvent the wheel, make the wheels role and the car move!! Make actors/organisations collaborate (spider in the web picture)
- Make up a roadmap, action plan, targets, etc
- =>>>> CONCLUSION:
- Take steps according to what fits best to your AKIS, focus & work solution oriented but keeping the ultimate goal of more knowledge flows always in mind
- Frequent NETWORKING AND COLLABORATION related to K&I



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What activities for AKIS Coordination Bodies in practice?

CAP networks, impartial advisors and researchers at MS level to improve collaboration within the AKIS for increased innovation and knowledge flows:

1. MS' CAP networks tasks and objectives:

- Provide for more learning (=filtering, translating, summarizing) from all 3000
 EU OGs and MA projects on EU EIP website => knowledge exchange among MS
- Organize a variety of knowledge <u>events</u> between in your country between AKIS
 actors including all in the knowledge-exchange and knowledge-building process
- Be more active on linkages between OGs and the Horizon Europe projects:
 capture the results and added value of the policy at European level (HE NCPs)
- Foster innovation: connect OGs within the MS and across borders
- 2. Researchers more closely involved in the AKIS: (inter)acting on farmers' needs/opportunities, and <u>rewarded to do so</u>. Researchers to join specific "multi-actor" activities and <u>publish for practice and support & interact with advisors' back-offices too</u>. "Partnership agreement" of Agri Ministries in particular with research and innovation ministries. Strive to make legislation which requires <u>real impact from research</u>.

What activities for AKIS CB in practice:

- **3.** More, more frequent and more diverse EIP Operational Group calls. The EIP now covers all 9 CAP specific objectives: mixing bottom-up calls with thematic calls to have a "family of EIP calls" (e.g. OGs on bottom-up grassroots ideas + on specific environmental challenges, on piloting digital tools & measures, on social innovation). New OG types: networks, knowledge hubs, innovation support services, result-based projects. Also initiate cross-sectorial and transnational OGs and the possibility for collaboration between OGs within the MS (national CAP network task in coordination with the Man. Authority).
- 4. Advisors to become more competent on economic, environmental and social issues & up-to-date knowledge and innovation. Simplification of the administrative system for advisors: no more rules on certification or public procurement, transparency via public website on the advisors available, vouchers. MS must have impartial advisors and innovation support services + provide training to advisors. The AKIS system must integrate all advisors, public and private: no more silos or separated FAS (Farm Advisory System). Holistic and interactive advice, targeted and on-farm. Mobility budget for advisors.

What activities for AKIS CB in practice:

- 5. A financial envelope is needed in a globally more commercialized, world full of public good-related challenges, to protect public knowledge & knowledge flows, and incentivize publicly shared innovation => AKIS.
 - emerging knowledge reservoirs at national level, national thematic networks
 - public back-offices ("knowledge hubs") with specialist advisors closely interacting with field advisors, research and CAP networks
 - National and Horizon <u>EU advisory networks</u>
 - Public digital advisory tools reducing maintenance costs: H2020 project Fairshare
 - Face-to-face multi-actor thematic events, on-farm demonstrations etc.
 - Soft ways also improve knowledge flows e.g. co-location of research, advice and networks (+education, farmers' organization, food cluster, etc.): co-location is cheap, efficient and informal
 - An AKIS coordination body, (inter)acting as the spider in the AKIS web of the country, interconnecting all key AKIS influencers

Actions related to AKIS Strategic Approach: KNOWLEDGE FLOWS

- 1. Enhancing knowledge flows and strengthening links between research and practice: incentivise researchers for their impact beyond academia, e.g. in their careers, by making practice ready outputs, meet practitioners frequently/thematic events, organise on-farm demonstrations where farmers and researchers meet and talk, education for researchers on interactive innovation approaches etc
- 2. Strengthening farm advisory services within MS' AKISs: capturing and sharing farmers' needs, acting as innovation brokers/facilitators, participating in and sharing knowledge from OG innovative projects, advisors' training and thematic events to update knowledge, crossvisits (learning peer-to-peer), spend time with researchers,...
- 3. Incentivising interactive innovation projects (OGs, H2020 MA): help connecting actors, facilitating cross-border and transnational calls/knowledge exchange, establish innovation support services to develop projects and capture farmers' foresters needs and innovative ideas, support intergenerational renewal by experts' collaboration...
- 4. Support digital transition in agriculture: EIP OGs on digital innovation, build, interlink and make use of knowledge reservoirs for practice, digital skills development,...

CAP plans post 2020 - main new AKIS issues

- -The CAP Strategic Plans regulation provides many new or improved tools for AKIS under the Cross-Cutting Objective:
- **-Farm advice**: MS must have impartial advisors integrated within the AKIS covering all sustainability fields with up-to-date K&I, **obligatory training**
- -Support for **knowledge exchange** and information events, including for advice, demo and training, **thematic and cross-sectorial events**
- -Obligation to provide innovation support for OGs from grassroots ideas
- -CAP networks (Art. 126): will connect <u>existing OGs to collaborate</u> & interact with Horizon Europe NCPs (seminar June 2021: see EIP website, next seminar AKIS 14-15 June 2023)
- -EIP OG projects (Art. 127): <u>80% cofinancing instead of 43%, whole project lump</u> sums. Advance payments up to 50% for OGs will help initiatives of smaller partners.
- -State Aid derogation till 500.000 Euro project for OGs (new ABER)
- -100% support for non-productive investments for OGs

WHY focus on AKIS? A reinforced AKIS integrates all AKIS actors and

ensures knowledge flows inside Member States & across borders



Operational Groups and H2020 Multi-Actor projects), see Art 127(3):


Collaboration between various actors to make **best use of complementary types of knowledge** (scientific, practical, organisational, etc) in view of **co-creation** and **quick spreading** of solutions/opportunities **ready to implement in practice.**

• **EU wide knowledge and innovation network** linking actors: communication, partnering, dissemination, knowledge flows and collecting practice needs (*Open science*)




Agriculture will be more and more knowledge-intensive

EIP-AGRI – What did we achieve?

- ✓ 26(27) Member States, 98 rural development programmes implementing EIP Operational Group "innovative projects"
- ✓ in 2014-2022 (7 years) more than 3000 OGs running or finished (still 2,5 years to go) = > 1 bio €
- ✓ Next CAP draft plans: <u>almost 3 x more OGs for only</u>
 <u>5 years + more variety in interventions</u> (not only
 "Agricultural productivity & sustainability")
- ✓ Total H2020 & HE: 352 MAA projects (~49% till 2024)
- ✓ 190 multi-actor projects under Horizon 2014-2020 (two thirds of total projects) for **1 bio Euro** many more to come.... => A growing and thriving network:

An increasing volume of practiceoriented knowledge to be managed!
