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National vs regional

Estonian CAP SP— one national-level strategy

- AKIS organisation based on the one door principle
- However, regional specifics need to be considered (accessibility, topics, language)
- Knowledge reservoir, online trainings etc ICT tools help to level out regional disadvantages (remote areas)

Institutional reform towards AKIS in 2023

ECRI – mainly crop-related applied research

cerrical control called AKIS related activities, including the so-called AKIS centre.


"AKIS centre" – not a structural unit with such name, but a cluster of AKIS-related responsibilities working in close cooperation with NRN at the Network Department

EARC – lab services, NRN, coordinator of long-term programme for knowledge exchange, accreditation of agricultural advisors


Jan 2023:

Estonian Crop Research Institute and Estonian Agricultural Research Centre were merged into the Centre of Estonian Rural Research and Knowledge





One door principle – the structure of the "AKIS centre"



- AKIS centre is the implementing body for AKIS activities and responsible for coordinating the advisory services, knowledge exchange and innovation support.
- Input and strategic guidance for the AKIS centre derives from two directions the AKIS council (stakeholders, the sector's interests) and the CB at the Ministry (strategic guidance, national and EU perspective)
- The staff at the AKIS centre is not necessarily the advisor, the trainer, the lecturer at a seminar, etc the emphasis is on the coordination. Cooperation and *ad hoc* involvement of the university staff, independent advisors, experts, leading farmers, etc is essential.
- The work related to ICT development is carried out by the experts at ARIB in close cooperation with the AKIS centre.

Intervention 0.1: Developing AKIS - the functions of the AKIS centre

AKIS development

- Analyses Estonian
 AKIS as a whole
- Maps the development trends
- Promotes the KT and A services
 - Facilitates

cooperation in Estonia and abroad

Advisory Service

- Manages the rendering of supported advice
 - Assures quality of the service
- Maintains the database of advisors
- -Filters research information for field advisors
- Plans and organises training of the existing as well as new advisors

Networking of advisors

Knowledge Exchange

- Coordinates and organises various activities for knowledge transfer and information exchange
- Monitors the needs for information and training
- Manages the distribution of AKIS vouchers (incl reporting)

Digital Solutions

- Maintaining and updating the Knowledge Reservoir
- Helpdesk for other units,
 advisors, etc AKIS actors on using digital solutions

Intervention 0.1: Developing AKIS

- Some highlights in knowledge transfer activities:
- More diverse formats of training activities possible, such as:
- advisor/researcher work shadowing programmes
- joint study trips for mixed group of farmers/advisors/researchers
- AKIS vouchers
- Knowledge reservoir as a multifunctional online portal for AKIS-related information (one gate to access information, events calendar, training handouts, etc).
- Special attention: new entrants in agriculture(currently, some prior experience is needed to be considered eligible for trainings)
- The goal is better cooperation, better coordination, better responsiveness to feedback

Intervention 0.1: Developing AKIS

- Some highlights in advisory services coordination:
- Coordination of the services will be part of the AKIS centre (0.1), while 0.2 (Advisory Services) will cover the cost of the advice provided to the client.
- Diversified formats: individual advice, group actions (discussion groups), online consultations, mentoring, self-service in knowledge reservoir, vouchers,
- Collaboration (mixing advisors with researchers), integration with other AKIS players.
- Attention to next generation of advisors \rightarrow a scheme for new advisors, involving retired advisors as mentors for the beginners.
- Need to nurture the motivation of the existing advisors; various types of (obligatory) training.
- Promoting advisory and knowledge exchange services to clients.
