
AGENDA 3rd Meeting Responses to the Cost-of-Living Crisis

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The CAP Implementation Contact Point (CAPI CP) of the EU CAP Network, in partnership with the European Commission's Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development, is organising a third session of the 'Forum on Best Practices in the Agri-Food Supply Chain', launched in 2021 as one of the actions envisaged under the Farm to Fork Strategy with the aim of enhancing cooperation between primary producers, improving their position within the food supply chain and increasing market transparency.

Building on discussions and outcomes of the previous sessions of the Forum, the present event will focus on the impacts of inflation. In particular, the event will:


