




# Distribution of support - type of interventions (total public expenditure)






### Eco-schemes' allocations (ring-fencing)





### Main features

Number of eco-schemes set out by MS




- The 28 CSPs have set out 158 ecoschemes
- Most CSP propose several eco-schemes, each of which is relatively specific to a given objective
- 6 CSP « whole-farm-approach » (CZ, SK also planned a more specific one)
- Variability of design and environmental ambition – overall framework, individual practices
- Payments: only 18% are based on payments additional to the BISS and the rest are "compensatory" (limiting WTO rules)
- Most are annual, with few exceptions
- Usually defined per main land use (arable, grassland, PC), not sector-specific


Figure 4: Share of the EU's utilised agricultural area (UAA) under mandatory and additional actions related to climate and environment<sup>12</sup> (Source: Approved CAP plans)

Number of schemes by main practice








#### Number of practices relevant for soils


Number of practices relevant for landscape features and biodiversity





Number of practices relevant for pesticides and fertilisation





### Implementation in 2023 - summary

- Overall good level of uptake, despite the context (inflation, high prices)
- Few MS had **low uptake** resulting in difficulties for executing the budget: flexibility mechanism under the learning period
- **Exceptional** solution proposed <u>only</u> for 2023:
  - retroactive increase of Maximum PUA of BISS (and CRISS in DE) to absorb underspending- ensure equal treatment of farmers
  - ➤ Compensation of the amounts planned for ES that will be used for BISS thanks to the retroactive increase of MUA, on top of the "compensations" laid down in Art. 97
  - Commitment to increase ES' allocations after 2025 stated in CSP amendment

#### Amendments:

- ➤ 22 CSP introduced amendments including ES: mostly fine tuning of commitments, simplifications, new practices, increasing UA and its variability,
- ➤ Only 5 CSP did not amend ES in 2023 (AT, EE, FI, IE, FR)
- > 1 CSP with ES amendments planned for end of the year (IT)
