Introduction

The Thematic Group (TG) on Nurturing Skills for a Thriving and Sustainable Agricultural Sector will aim to explore needs and opportunities related to agricultural skills development and their updating, with a focus on the agricultural workforce and on the (new) skills needed to strengthen farmers in the food-supply chain.
