- Promote organic farming
- Need to find alternatives to the use of contentious inputs in organic farming

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Increased availability, accessibility and adoption of cost-efficient alternatives
- Fair, reliable and implementable rules on the use of inputs in organic farming
- Reduced environmental impact and enhanced production
- Scientific support and recommendations for policy
- **Networking and knowledge** exchange
- Stronger R&I system on organic farming



HORIZON-CL6-2024-FARM2FORK-01-1-TWO STAGE

SCOPE

- Develop, test and put in the place alternative products and solutions for organic plant and animal production
- Develop toolboxes, strategies and technologies for minimization/phasingout of the use of contentious inputs
- Demonstrate the safety of the alternatives
- Generate data to enable registration of the alternatives
- Analyse and produce data on efficacy, resource efficiency, climate and environmental impacts of alternatives
- Analyse farmers' and consumers' acceptance of alternatives
- Consider new governance models/relations among food chain actors
- Set up demonstration sites, participatory activities and knowledge exchange
- Develop training packages and awareness raising



- Multi-actor approach
- TRL 7-8
- Build on past achievements (e.g. RELACS and Organic-PLUS projects)
- Sectors with high economic relevance
- Cooperation with other projects funded under this topic + running/upcoming projects focusing on organic farming and agroecology -> upcoming partnership on Agroecology

- Implementation of Organic Action Plan, Action 14: "foster local and small-scale processing"
- Substantial differences between Member States on share of agricultural land dedicated to organic farming
- Lack of organic products adapted logistics in some MS



Support the establishment of adequate structures that enable the proper channeling of organic production in supply chains

EU R&I system for organic farming and agroeocology



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Reinforced local and small-volume processing of organic food;
- Boosted innovative sustainable packaging solutions resulting in reduced waste
- Fostered innovative supply and distribution models and short trade circuits;
- Added value to organic products, improved organic farmers' incomes and positioning in value chains
- **Enhanced market orientation** and capacity of farmers and SMEs processors to **meet consumer demand** for organic food;
- Increased availability, affordability and accessibility of organic food with positive impacts on environmental sustainability and public health



HORIZON-CL6-2024-FARM2FORK-02-2-two-stage

SCOPE

- Establish and animate locally-driven, multi-actor organic food innovation hubs, bringing together researchers, innovators, farmers, processors
- Develop, test and pilot innovations in organic small-scale and careful food processing and new, sustainable and reusable packaging (avoiding nonrenewable and fossil-derived plastics) safeguarding the quality, safety and prolonging shelflife of products;
- Foster innovative solutions/approaches tailored to farmers and SMEs
 (such as seasonality and small(er) batches processing); assess their impacts
 on environmental, economic and social (including health) sustaintability
- Explore and **develop innovative supply and distribution models** (business models, market outlets and strategies, short trade circuits, public procurement, food services), adapted to the proposed innovative solutions;
- Build a **community of practice** to share learnings, build capacity and support adoption of innovations at scale.
- Cover a range of representative organic crops in Europe, including indoor/ outdoor, arable and perennial, as well as the organic livestock sector.

- Dedicated task, appropriate resources and a plan on how they will collaborate with other projects funded under this topic
- Collaborate with relevant projects in calls HORIZON-CL6-2023-GOVERNANCE-01-20, and the future partnerships Agroecology and 'Sustainable food systems

POLICY CONTEXT





at least 25% of the EU's agricultural land under organic farming by 2030

Action plan for the development of organic production in the EU → Action 9

New knowledge and innovative ideas are not sufficiently shared with and adopted by organic farmers.

Successful proposals need to:

- provide organic farming producers with impartial and tailored knowledge;
- speed up innovation and the uptake of results;
- contribute to effective Agriculture Knowledge and Innovation Systems (AKIS).



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Support for the implementation of the CAP's cross-cutting objective and the Action Plan for the Development of Organic Production
- Collection, distribution and dissemination to farmers of easily accessible practice-oriented knowledge
- Increased flow of practical information between farmers in the EU and Associated Countries
- Greater user acceptance of collected solutions and a more intensive dissemination of existing knowledge



SCOPE

- <u>Describe</u> comprehensively the **state of available knowledge of organic farming practices** on the chosen theme and justify the added-value and the relevance of the theme, and explaining how duplication with ongoing or completed projects and networks is avoided.
- <u>Summarise</u>, <u>share</u> and <u>present</u> the **existing best practices** and **research findings** that are ready to be put into practice.
- <u>Deliver</u> an extensive range of useful, applicable and appealing **material for organic farmers** → <u>feed into</u> **existing dissemination channels** most consulted by farmers in the different countries.
- <u>Spread</u> **outcomes widely beyond the organic farming community** and reach also farmers involved in carbon farming, low-input farming, circular agriculture or agroecology.
- Ensure the long-term availability of the practical knowledge collected.
- <u>Include</u> a dedicated **task**, **appropriate resources and a plan** on how they will ensure synergies with the activities carried out by projects selected under the topics:
 - ✓ HORIZON-CL6-2023-GOVERNANCE-01-20,
 - ✓ HORIZON-CL6-2024-FARM2FORK-02-1-two-stage, and
 - ✓ HORIZON-CL6-2023-FARM2FORK-01-3.



KEEP IN MIND

- <u>Focus on</u> knowledge sharing that addresses the most urgent needs of organic farmers, involved in plant production and/or animal husbandry.
- Focus on the cost/benefit aspects of the practices identified.
- Include conversion and business plans in the end-user material for farmers.
- <u>Take into consideration</u> the differences between countries/regions/territories.
- "Practice abstracts" and other materials should be provided to:
 - ✓ EIP-AGRI,
 - ✓ national/regional/local AKIS channels, and
 - ✓ EU wide knowledge reservoir <u>EU-FarmBook</u>
- Details on the EIP Operational Groups and synergies
- Multi-actor approach, activating farmers / foresters and advisors, p. 21-23
- Minimum of 3 years
- Important for the future agroecology partnership → HORIZON-CL6-2023-FARM2FORK-01-1
