- empowered, engaged, and equipped rural communities in and for the green transition
- rural communities take advantage of data, interoperable platforms and digital technologies available to help them meet climate-neutrality objectives
- policy makers are better informed about policy and regulatory frameworks, conditions and processes that are likely to encourage rural areas' climate-neutrality while sustaining an adequate social welfare and wellbeing
- a stronger rural innovation ecosystem is in place bringing together public and private players and making rural areas an attractive place for innovators to work and live



HORIZON-CL6-2024-COMMUNITIES-02-1-two-stage

SCOPE

- design, prototype and test concrete innovations (technical, social, organisational) supporting climateneutrality, zero pollution and biodiversity enhancement in rural communities; Innovations should be co-created with rural stakeholders
- include training and capacity building for local administrations and rural stakeholders to create and maintain a rural innovation ecosystem and enable them to make use or benefit from the successful innovations developed and from existing funding opportunities for the green and digital transitions
- boost networking and enhance peer-to-peer learning between communities and capitalise on lessons learnt making them available as recommendations for policy makers at various levels (European, national, regional and local)



- Multi-actor approach
- Involve social sciences and humanities (SSH)
- Cover various biogeographical regions with a balanced coverage reflecting the various pedoclimatic zones in Europe in a representative way
- Build on preliminary results of HE projects GRANULAR and RUSTIK
- Synergies with the the 'sister' project under this topic

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Farmers and/or other rural actors will:
 - adopt innovative inclusive and sustainable business and production models for sustainability
 - improve their position in the value chains thanks to inclusiveness, fairness, financial sustainability of trading relationships
- Measure and track economic, social, environmental sustainability of farming systems and rural businesses is possible though innovative technologies
- New jobs opportunities as a result of innovative and sustainable production and business models

HORIZON-CL6-2024-COMMUNITIES-02-2-two-stage



AREA A - farming

- Design, test and upscale bottom-up of community-led innovative business, cooperation and production models
- Monitor and verify improved social, environmental and climate performance
 and translate it into economic benefits
- Investigate the trends in adoption of innovation in farms and how farmers innovate their business, cooperation or production models
- Connect citizens, private companies and public organisations with farmers to increase demand for sustainable agriculture

AREA B - rural businesses

Pilot innovative sustainable business and cooperation models to foster wealth and well-being of rural communities and villages

Investigate the potential of social economy, cooperatives and develop at least one demonstrator that involves people in a vulnerable situation

Explore cross-sectoral and cross-territory linkages

Examine the impacts of innovation on development and revitalisation of rural areas

- Identify barriers, drivers and conditions for sustainable business models in rural areas
- Recommendation to policy makers for supporting sustainable business models



- Multi-actor approach
- Social innovation and innovative forms of cooperation
- Involve social sciences and humanities (SSH)
- Build on SMARTCHAIN, NEWBIE, agroBRIDGES, CO-FRESH, RUBIZMO, LIVERUR, etc.
- Collaborate with the 'sister' project
- International cooperation is strongly encouraged, in particular with China (EU-China Food, Agriculture and Biotechnology (FAB) flagship initiative)
