





   December 2023 on the <u>EU CAP</u>



### Workshop 'National Networking for Innovation' 30 November – 1 December 2023, Tallinn, Estonia

• The workshop involved <u>79 participants</u> mainly from National CAP Networks, also Managing Authorities, AKIS Coordination Bodies, some Horizon National Contact Points and Horizon projects. The participants covered 26 Member States.

#### **Objectives:**

- Share different networking approaches and tools to support a well-functioning AKIS;
- Discuss and exchange ideas with National CAP Networks on their roles in the Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System (AKIS) and the related tasks and objectives as stipulated by Art. 126(3)(e) and 126(4)(d)(e);
- Stimulate further collaboration between National CAP Networks and the European CAP Network in the context of networking for innovation and knowledge exchange.
- Exchange ideas on ongoing and planned **networking activities** with a view on identifying synergies and complementarities, such as **cross-border and transnational cooperation.**





#### Some lessons learned

- A cross-cutting lesson from the interactive sessions is that <u>practical approaches</u> <u>must be people-centred and challenge-centred;</u> and that bundling of multiple practical approaches and tools is likely to be needed in ensuring that different actors across the AKIS are effectively engaged and mobilised for innovation.
- The importance of National CAP Networks <u>better connecting with researchers</u> and advisors took a specific focus, considering the key functions that research and advice have in providing content for and coordinating knowledge flows in well-functioning AKISs.
- Collecting information and facilitating dissemination and networking of funded structures and projects, such as EIP Operational Groups, is a necessary ingredient for success providing knowledge as fuel for innovation across all AKIS cohorts.





### Seminar 'Skills and lifelong learning for agricultural advisory and training service providers' – 21-22 February 2024 – Vienna, Austria

- 135 participants, 26 MSs (+ North Macedonia)
- Main points of discussions:
  - identifying good practices/methods/ approaches to delivering skills
  - improving the attractiveness of training and lifelong learning – how to make it….? What are the challenges?
  - mapping of relevant actors, projects and activities in skills, training and lifelong learning
