Targetting "Hard to Reach"

- The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine are delivering a
 nationwide rollout of face-to-face Farmer Clinics aimed at aiding farmers in
 completing their online applications for the <u>Basic Income Support for</u>
 <u>Sustainability</u> (BISS) and other relevant area-based schemes.
- These BISS Farmer Clinics feature Department personnel offering personalised assistance to farmers, ensuring their scheme applications are submitted ahead of Wednesday the 15th of May 2024 deadline.
- These clinics are especially beneficial for farmers lacking a <u>FAS-approved</u> advisor to aid them in their application process.

- Positive interactives with the farming community.



Regional Webinars



- CAP Network Ireland, in conjunction with <u>DAFM</u>, facilitated four online regional webinars in order to provide guidance and additional information about the KT programme. Each of the four events included presentations from CAP Network Ireland, DAFM and guest experts.
- 280 farm advisors participated in the events. The webinars were also uploaded to Youtube for people who couldn't attend.
- The events assisted advisors to identify "the local need" in consultation with their clients. The identification of local needs is a new concept.
- We provide instructions and resources on how to assist the advisors.

EIP-Agri Capacity Building Webinars



Building Capacity and Managing Managing Expectations

- CAP Network Ireland will host a capacity building webinar for potential EIP-Agri Operational Groups later this month.
- Learnings from the previous programme tell us that groups need support and advice in writing their applications. Given the success of EIP-Agri in Ireland, we envision a high volume of applications under many calls.
- This webinar aims to increase the standard of applications received while also reducing the administrative burden on the MA.
- After the webinar, attendees will be sent a pack including a partner search form, application resources and evaluator guidelines.
- The CAP Network will also deliver capacity building workshops with the successful applicants.

Final Thoughts



- Farmer engagement is complex and resource-intensive but worthwhile in delivering better outcomes for both the administrations and farmers.
- To reduce administration burden on farmers and advisors, they must be provided them with the tools and confidence to participate.


