Objectives of the workshop

An ever-growing share of the EU's agri-food salaried workforce is composed of seasonal and migrant workers (both of intra and extra EU origin), as highlighted most vividly during the pandemic. Such workers may find themselves vulnerable to abuses, with limited access to certain fundamental rights related to working and living conditions, and even lack basic services. The aim of this seminar will be to develop a strategic approach to address these challenges in a systematic and forward-looking way involving both policymakers and stakeholders at the EU level and to share the outcomes of the seminar with the EU agri-food Strategic Dialogue.

This Policy Workshop aims to synthesize the latest and most relevant scientific research and practical insights from a wide variety of stakeholders. We will facilitate debate and sharing of perspectives among those actors and European policymakers directly involved on issues related to labour standards and living and working conditions of migrant and seasonal workers in the sector. By gathering the latest evidence, we seek to provide policymakers with the knowledge and evidence needed to drive positive change.
