
Returning value to farmers

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The EU CAP Network, in cooperation with the European Commission's Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development, is organising a fourth session of the 'Forum on Best Practices in the Agri-Food Supply Chain', launched in 2021 as one of the actions envisaged under the Farm to Fork Strategy with the aim of enhancing cooperation between primary producers, improving their position within the food supply chain and increasing market transparency.
