- 1. Prescription actions, where set payment was made for satisfactory completion of task(s).
- 2. Results-based actions where rate of payment will depend on score achieved.



8 CP Zones 5 CP Teams

These zones are recognised as having high-nature value; holding significant carbon stores; and as the location of "some of the most pristine waters in the country



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Role of the CP Teams

- •Facilitate co-operation between farmers, advisors, state agencies and local government departments to implement actions to "improve the local environment and the viability of these high-priority rural areas.
- •Are "multi-disciplinary" groups featuring ecologists, hydrologists, ornithologists and project managers.
- •Engage with farmers with "advice and best practice" to maintain or improve the habitats on their holdings. They will also act as a conduit for the department in the administration of payments.
- •Provide advisors and farmers with local, detailed, expert advice on how to maintain and improve habitats at farm and landscape level by way of Non-Productive Investments and Landscape Actions
- Screen NPI Annual Works Plan (AWP)
- •Development/delivery of Local Action Plans cumulative environmental benefits at scale

ACRES actions: Quality/Results-Based Payment Approach




- Payments linked to biodiversity/habitat quality

- Supporting extensive livestock grazing systems








