### The contribution of LAGs in the field of social inclusion (social work) from various perspectives

Regions, municipalities and target groups. LAGs in the area of social inclusion as a win-win measure for all actors involved. Presentation of LAG activities in the field of social work: examples of regions/municipalities where cooperation is effectively established, examples from small municipalities (mayors) and concrete benefits for their communities, and possibly also the client's perspective (= "client-centered" approach). # The role and potential of LAGs in the field of <u>volunteering</u> and civic engagement, intergenerational activities and support for <u>informal and shared care</u>

What is volunteering, what forms it can take, related legislation, the potential of LAGs in developing volunteering. How volunteering can be used to improve the social situation of caregivers and their families and what role does LAG play in this (active search for volunteers, their training, coordination, public awareness). ## Capacity building of LAGs and linking community work

and individual social work with the prevention of energy poverty and environmental issues

Energy counselling/energy poverty prevention - connecting with community work or individual social work, including debt counselling, linking with the social climate fund. Environmental activities as part of LAG community activities, opportunities to involve young people in environmental community activities to find solutions, children's mental health, and stress prevention/management, social consequences of adapting to climate change - community work, community energy: focus on working with the community.
