

# Protecting Democracy against Disinformation: The European Experience

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## Disinformation:

“false or misleading content that is spread with an intention to deceive or secure economic or political gain and which may cause public harm”

(Code of Conduct, 2025)

**Influence operations** coordinated efforts by either domestic or foreign actors to influence a target audience using a range of deceptive means,

**Foreign interference:** coercive and deceptive efforts to disrupt the free formation and expression of individuals’ political will by a foreign state actor or its agents often as part of a broader hybrid operation

## Misinformation:

No intention to harm

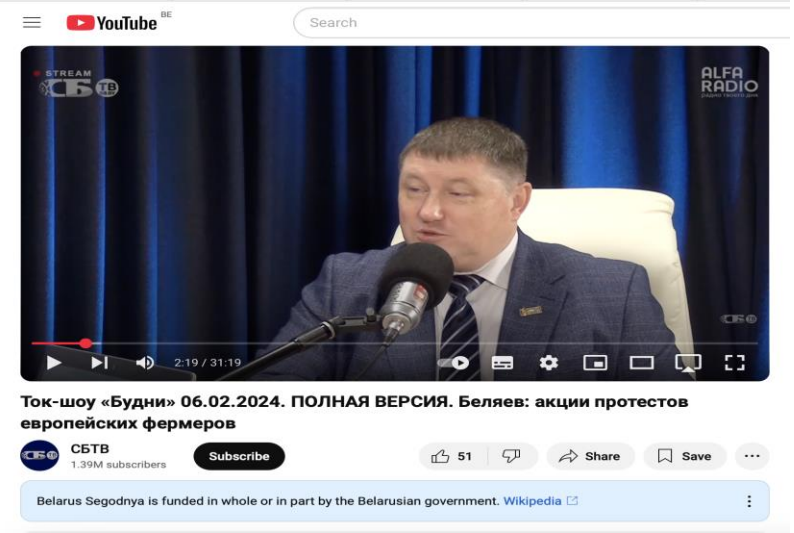

# Tackling Disinformation: a multidimensional approach



Respecting fundamental rights, including freedom of expression  
Citizens' right to make informed decision in democratic processes

Making **online platforms** more transparent and accountable, through soft- and hard law

Improving the capabilities of **public institutions** to detect, analyse and expose foreign interference and hybrid threats

Creating an enabling environment for **Media Freedom** and resilient democracy

A **whole-of-society approach** (including media, civil society, academia and private sector) to understand the threats, calibrate responses and empower citizens

## Making online platforms more accountable

### The Digital Services Act (DSA)

#### No Liability Principle, subject to conditions:

- Common transparency and accountability rules for ALL online platforms

#### Enhanced obligations for Very Large Online Platforms and Search Engines (VLOPSEs), i.e. with more than 45 million monthly active users:

- **Annual assessment of systemic risks** stemming from the design or use of services (e.g. dissemination of illegal content, negative effects on civic discourse and electoral processes, and public security)
- **Adoption of effective risk mitigation measures**, respectful of fundamental rights, including self-regulatory codes
- **Independent audits**
- **Hefty sanctions** in case of non-compliance
