Exploring the notion of fairness in EU policy

<u>BEATLES</u> is a Horizon Europe project (2022-2026) focused on behavioural analysis to develop transformational pathways to foster the transition to fair, healthy and environmentally friendly food systems and the adoption of Climate-Smart Agriculture (CSA) and smart farming technologies in five <u>Use Cases</u>.

Within the project, <u>AEIDL</u> (European Association for Innovation in Local Development) is leading the work package on transition through <u>policy recommendations</u> and tools.

While still relatively **underexplored** in the EU political sphere, the concept of fairness is gaining increasing attention in the current political landscape. We consider the <u>notion of fairness</u> to be a core principle in shaping EU policies, encompassing all four key dimensions: (1) distributive fairness, (2) procedural fairness, (3) interpersonal fairness, and (4) informational fairness.

Last May 2024, AEIDL published the <u>Policy Brief</u> 'The notion of supply chain fairness in the <u>EU policies related to Climate-Smart Agriculture'</u>. It attempts to shed light on the understanding of the concept, and it encompasses a detailed examination of fairness within European Law, with a focus on the Common Agricultural <u>Policy</u> and the broader food policy framework.

In light of the increasing prominence of the concept in key documents—such as the Strategic Dialogue report on the future of EU Agriculture, the EU consultation on farm policy, the Communication on 'The Road to the next Multiannual Financial Framework', and the Vision for Agriculture and Food—AEIDL conducted a consultation between November 2024 and April 2025 with experts in agriculture, environmental policy, and EU law to explore the notion of fairness in policy design, implementation, and evaluation.

This session of the EU multi-actor working group aims to further explore the concept of fairness in EU policy, building on the work completed so far in the project, incorporating perspectives from various stakeholders within European institutions, as well as insights from experts consulted throughout the process.
