



Technology Readiness Level (TRL)



Primary producers are key actors in circular bio-based value chains:

They are biomass suppliers, but also rural entrepreneurs and managers of the landscape as well as end-users of bio-based innovations.










CBE JU & primary sector

CBE JU aims at strengthening and empowering the primary sector in the circular bio-based systems and value chains

The goal is to secure a sustainable supply of biomass while at the same time creates value in rural areas delivering jobs, economic growth and development.

The Council Regulation calls for the mobilisiation and integration of feedstock providers to cooperate in projects





What CBE JU done/is doing?

- BBI JU- Study in 2019 analysis of participation of farmers in BBI projects and recommendations to improve the participation in R&I projects and more generally in the value chains → Action Plan
- Annual Work Programmes (topics and requirements promoting innovations for primary sector): driven by topics (e.g., business models focused on cooperatives of farmers), Multi Actor Approach, references/requests to involve primary producers (direct or indirect) depending on the topics.
- Monitor the involvement of primary producers using a specific KPI
- Communication campaigns for primary producers & raising awareness opportunities
- Set out an ad-hoc WG on primary producers (preparations started in 2024)



Beyond the participation in the funded projects .. The circular bioeconomy offers primary producers the opportunity to diversify their businesses, add value, and create additional revenue streams



OBJECTIVES of the WG:

- Empower primary producers to play an active and rewarding role in circular bio-based value chains
- Ensure they benefit from the economic, social, and environmental opportunities these systems offer (supported by longterm, sustainable, and feasible business models).



The Working Group scope



 Implement ACTIONS to address the challenges faced by the primary sector and to harness opportunities offered by circular bio-based innovations. Sectors covered:

- Agricultural sector
- Forestry and aquaculture
- Blue primary sectors (aquaculture & fisheries)
- Action Plan: sector & cross-sector
- Cooperation industry & primary sector and with other actors: policy-makers, regional authorities, etc.
- Build on existing work done by other initiatives/ projects (widening actions, projects funded to support business models, etc.)
- Use existing networks and initiatives



Call for stakeholders to join the working group on primary producers

CBE JU invites stakeholders to apply to a new initiative focused on addressing challenges faced by primary producers in implementing circular bio-based solutions.

Type of activities/tasks (an action plan will define the concrete actions)



1. Awareness & better understanding

Targeted communication of opportunities & benefits offered by circular bio-based innovations



4. Synergies & knowledge transfer

Capitalise on existing initiatives & networks and facilitate knowledge transfer



2. Cooperation with other actors

Action to improve including primary producers, industry, regional stakeholders, advisors, and endusers



5. Advisory services

Filling gaps in the offered services and ensuring wider use of available knowledge



3. Business models

Giving benefits to primary producers and Profit is equally/fairly shared among all the actors in the value chain



6. Widening actions

Mobilise primary producers from regions with unexploited potential and engage with them in value chains

Opportunities for innovation & Call 2025



Are you ready to unlock new business opportunities?

You can achieve this by transforming residues into sustainable bio-based products that effectively replace non-renewable materials

What if you could turn unused or underutilised resources into new income sources?

This can be accomplished by converting leftovers and using marginal land to create new revenue streams that diversify operations and strengthen rural economies

How can bio-based solutions make agriculture more sustainable?

By providing soil enhancers, fertilisers and pesticides with a significantly lower environmental impact





€172 million call for project proposals launched

The CBE JU 2025 call for project proposals is now open for submission. A total of €172 million will be dedicated to advancing competitive circular bio-based industries in Europe across 13 topics. All stakeholders of the circular bio-based sector can apply before the deadline of 18 September 2025, 17:00 Brussels time.




