## Horizon Europe funding for agriculture, forestry and rural areas

Horizon Europe is the largest source of public funding for research and innovation from the European Commission. It has a budget of €95.5 billion, of which around €9 billion is dedicated to Cluster 6 on 'Food, Bioeconomy, Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment' for 2021-2027.

Through Cluster 6, Horizon Europe addresses issues that farmers, foresters and rural communities face. It funds projects to build innovative solutions together with researchers, advisors and other stakeholders, sharing knowledge and producing results that are ready to be put into practice.





Horizon Europe projects are actively supported by the EU CAP Network through innovation, knowledge exchange and the EIP-AGRI. Horizon Europe works across different themes to boost innovation.

This brochure highlights funding opportunities for agriculture, forestry and rural areas in Cluster 6 and other parts of the Horizon Europe Work Programme, and helps you find your way through the different calls for 2023.

## ► The Cluster 6 Work Programme at a glance

The Work Programme of Horizon Europe Cluster 6 provides research and innovation opportunities that aim to reduce environmental degradation, halt and reverse the decline of biodiversity and improve the management of natural resources in urban and rural areas. It will help to ensure food and nutrition security for all within planetary boundaries, and a clean and healthy environment through knowledge, innovation and digitalisation in agriculture, food systems and forestry.

Cluster 6 projects support the transition to a low-carbon, resource-efficient circular economy and a sustainable bioeconomy.

Research and innovation activities under Cluster 6 will contribute to the objectives of the [European Green Deal](#) related to the [Farm to Fork Strategy](#), the [Biodiversity Strategy for 2030](#), the [European Climate Pact](#), the [Long-term Vision for Rural Areas](#), the [Organic Action Plan](#) and the [Sustainable Development Goals](#).

## ► Multi-actor projects involving the agricultural community

The Horizon Europe Work Programme includes many multi-actor approach (MAA) topics. In multi-actor proposals, the people who will benefit from the project solutions need to be involved from the start: from developing the idea to implementing activities and sharing, demonstrating and disseminating the results. This should lead to demand-driven, reliable and innovative solutions that are more likely to be applied in the field.

## ► Thematic networks compiling knowledge ready for practice

Thematic networks (TN) are a particular type of multi-actor project. They collect and develop existing scientific knowledge and best practices that are insufficiently known or ready for farmers, foresters and rural communities to implement.

Thematic networks must translate this knowledge into easily understandable material, which should remain available beyond the lifespan of the project.

## ► Stronger AKIS through advisory networks

The Common Agricultural Policy (2023-2027) strengthens Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems (AKIS) across EU Member States, speeding up innovation and the uptake of research and innovation in the field.

Advisory support is essential in a well-functioning AKIS. Three topics in the '[Innovative governance](#)' destination focus on developing EU-wide Advisory Networks (AN) on organic agriculture, reducing pesticide use and optimal fertiliser use.

### EU Missions

Horizon Europe supports EU Missions as a new way to deliver practical solutions to some of our greatest challenges. The Missions entitled 'A Soil Deal for Europe' (M€ 126 for 2023) and 'Adaptation to Climate Change' (M€ 82.81 for 2023) are especially relevant to agriculture, forestry and rural areas. ### A Soil Deal for Europe

The Mission entitled 'A Soil Deal for Europe' aims to establish a network of 100 living labs and lighthouses in rural and urban areas, to lead the transition to healthy soils by 2030. This network will co-create knowledge, test solutions and demonstrate their value in real-life conditions, to address key soil health challenges such as desertification, soil carbon preservation, pollution, erosion, biodiversity loss or soil sealing.
